## **Qualifications for Office**

### **ALL CANDIDATES MUST:**

- Be a qualified elector of the State of Mississippi and of the district, county or county district of the office for which he seeks election.
- Never have been convicted of bribery, perjury or other infamous crime, being a crime punishable by a minimum of one (1) year confinement in the state penitentiary, i.e., all felonies, unless pardoned for the offense. *Miss. Const. of 1890, Article IV, § 44.*
- Never have been convicted of a felony in a court of this state, or, on or after December 8, 1992, of a felony in a federal court, or of an offense in the court of another state which is a felony under the laws of this state, as provided in Section 44 of the Mississippi Constitution; excluding, however, convictions of manslaughter and violations of the United States Internal Revenue Code or any violations of the tax laws of this state, unless the offense also involved the misuse or abuse of an office or money coming into a candidate's hands by virtue of an office.

### **SHERIFF**

#### **Qualifications:**

A candidate shall not be a defaulter to the state or any county or municipality or to the United States and a qualified elector. Must be a resident of the county they seek election in for two (2) years on the day before the election. *Miss. Code Ann. §19-25-3; Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. V, §§135 and 138; Miss. Code Ann. §23-15-300*

Each sheriff-elect shall, at the expense of the county, attend and complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Academy within one (1) year after taking the oath of office; excluding, however, those who have previously served as a sheriff or have had at least five (5) years' full-time law enforcement experience within a period of ten (10) years prior to the date of taking the oath of office, or have previously successfully completed a course of training at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Academy or the Jackson Policy Academy within five (5) years prior to the date of taking the oath of office.

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 50. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

## **CHANCERY CLERK**

### **Qualifications:**

A candidate for Chancery Clerk shall be a qualified elector of the county in which he seeks election. Must be a resident of the county they seek election in for two (2) years on the day before the election. *Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. V, §§135 and 138; Art. VI, §168; ART XII, §250; Miss. Code Ann. §23-15-300*

Each chancery clerk elected for a full term of office shall file in the office of the circuit clerk a certificate of completion of a course of training and education conducted by the Mississippi Judicial College of the University of Mississippi Law Center within six (6) months of the beginning of the term for which the clerk is elected. A chancery clerk who has completed the course of training and education and has satisfied his annual continuing education course requirements, and who is elected for a succeeding term shall not be required to repeat the training and education course upon reelection. Any chancery clerk who served a full or partial term before Jan. 1, 1996 shall be exempt from this requirement.

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 50. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

## **CIRCUIT CLERK**

### **Qualifications:**

A candidate for Circuit Clerk shall be a qualified elector of the county in which he seeks election. Must be a resident of the county they seek election in for two (2) years on the day before the election. *Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. V §§135 and 138; Art. VI, §168; Art. XII, §250; Miss. Code Ann. §23-15-300.*

Each circuit clerk elected for a full term of office shall file in the office of the chancery clerk a certificate of completion of a course of training and education conducted by the Mississippi Judicial College of the University of Mississippi Law Center within six (6) months of the beginning of the term for which the clerk is elected. A circuit clerk who has completed the course of training and education and has satisfied his annual continuing education course requirements, and who is elected for a succeeding term shall not be required to repeat the training and education course upon reelection. Any circuit clerk who served a full or partial term before Jan. 1, 1996 shall be exempt from this requirement. Each newly elected circuit clerk shall complete a computer skills training course within one hundred eighty (180) days of the commencement of their term; all serving circuit clerks shall complete a refresher course within one hundred eighty (180) days of the commencement of every odd-numbered term of service.

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 50. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

### **TAX ASSESSOR/COLLECTOR**

Qualifications:

A candidate for Tax Assessor or Tax Collector shall be a qualified elector of the county in which he seeks election. Must be a resident of the county they seek election in for two (2) years on the day before the election. *Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. V §§135 and 138; Art. VI, §168; Art. XII, §250; Miss. Code Ann. §23-15-300.*

Each tax assessor and tax collector shall attain certification through the Education and Certification Board, in cooperation with the Center for Governmental Training and Technology within the Mississippi State University Extension Service.

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 50. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

### **COUNTY ATTORNEY**

Qualifications: A qualified elector and a regular licensed and practicing attorney. MISS. CODE ANN. §19-23-1 et seq. Must be a resident of the county they seek election in for two (2) years on the day before the election. *Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. V §§135 and 138; Art. VI, §168; Art. XII, §250; Miss. Code Ann. §23-15-300.*

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 50. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

### **CORONER**

Qualifications: A qualified elector, at least 21 years of age, possessing a high school diploma or its equivalent, of the county in which he/she seeks election. The minimum education requirement shall not apply to any Coroner holding office on July 1, 1986, who is re-elected in the 1987 general election and thereafter as long as he/she maintains continuous active service. Must be a resident of the county they seek election in for two (2) years on the day before the election. *Miss. Code Ann. §19-21-103; Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. V, §§135 and 138; Art. XII, §250; Miss. Code Ann. §23-15-300.*

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 50. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

### **SUPERVISOR**

Qualifications: A qualified elector of the county and a resident for two (2) years, as of the day before the election, in the district in which he/she seeks election. *Miss. Code Ann. §19-3-3; Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. XII, §250.*

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 15. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

### **JUSTICE COURT JUDGE**

Qualifications: A qualified elector, a resident of the county two (2) years preceding the day of election, a high school graduate or its equivalent, and completion of a course of training required by law within six months of the beginning of the term of office. *Miss. Code Ann. §9-11-3; Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. VI, §171 and Art. XII, §250.* Each justice court judge shall be required to file in the office of the chancery clerk a certificate of completion of a course of training and education conducted by the Mississippi Judicial College of the University of Mississippi Law Center within six months of the beginning of the term of office. In addition, each justice court judge shall be required to file annually in the office of the chancery clerk a certificate of completion of a course of continuing education conducted by the Mississippi Judicial College.

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 15. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

### **CONSTABLE**

A qualified elector in the county and district in which he/she seeks election. Must be a resident of the county district in which he/she seeks election for two (2) years preceding the day of election. *Miss. Const. of 1890, Art. VI, §171 and Art. XII, §250.* During a constable's term of office, each constable shall attend and, to the extent to which he is physically able, participate in a curriculum having a duration of two (2) weeks which addresses the nature and scope of specific duties and

responsibilities of a constable and which includes firearm use and safety training, established by the Board on Law Enforcement Officers Standards and Training in the field of law enforcement at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy or such other training programs that are approved by the Board on Law Enforcement Officers Standards and Training. In addition, each constable shall complete eight (8) hours annually continuing education training.

Fee for party candidates: \$100 made payable to the appropriate county executive committee via Circuit Clerk.

Number of signatures required for Independent candidates: 15. \$100 qualifying fee to the county via the Circuit Clerk.

### **Elections Commissioner DISTRICTS 2 & 4 ONLY**

A qualified elector in the county and district in which he/she seeks election. Must be a resident of the county district in which he/she seeks election for two (2) years preceding the day of election. *Miss. Code Ann. §23-15-213, 23-15-300*

All candidates file a Statement of Intent and petition containing the signatures of not less than 50 qualified electors of the district with the Chancery Clerk no later than 5 pm on February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. No qualifying fee is paid.

### **For Countywide and County District Offices**

Qualifying as a Candidate for Party Nomination:

- 1) Qualifying Statement of Intent for a Candidate for Party Nomination, and
- 2) Qualifying fee made payable to the appropriate County Party Executive Committee.

The qualifying fee(s) for candidates seeking party nominations for countywide and county district offices are as follows:

- a. Sheriff, Chancery Clerk, Circuit Clerk, Tax Assessor, Tax Collector, County Attorney, Superintendent of Education and Supervisor: \$100.00, and
- b. Surveyor, Coroner, Justice Court Judge and Constable: \$100.00. *Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-297.*

3) Filed with the appropriate County Party Executive Committee,

4) No later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, February 1st, 2023. NOTE: The qualifying date is an actual receipt deadline and cannot be extended under any circumstance.

5) Statement of Economic Interest, within fifteen (15) days of qualifying, with the Mississippi Ethics Commission, 146 E. Amite Street, Rm. 103, Burroughs Bldg., Jackson, MS 39201; (601) 359-1285.

6) Required Campaign Finance Disclosure Reports filed with the appropriate Circuit Clerk's Office by 5:00 p.m. on the applicable deadline(s).

**Qualifying as an Independent Candidate:**

- 1) Qualifying Statement of Intent for a Candidate for an Independent Candidate, and
- 2) Qualifying Petition, signed by not less than the following number of qualified electors (registered voters), certified by the Circuit Clerk of the respective county from where the signatures were collected by the candidate:
  - a. Sheriff, Chancery Clerk, Circuit Clerk, Tax Assessor, Tax Collector, County Attorney, Coroner, and Superintendent of Education, not less than fifty (50) qualified electors,
  - b. Supervisor, Justice Court Judge and Constable, not less than fifteen (15) qualified electors. Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-359.
- 3) Filed with the appropriate County Circuit Clerk's office,
- 4) No later than 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 1st, 2023. NOTE: The qualifying date is an actual receipt deadline and cannot be extended under any circumstance.
- 5) Statement of Economic Interest, within fifteen (15) days of qualifying, with the Mississippi Ethics Commission, 146 E. Amite Street, Rm. 103, Burroughs Bldg., Jackson, MS 39201; (601) 359-1285. File online at [www.ethics.state.ms.us](http://www.ethics.state.ms.us).
- 6) Required Campaign Finance Disclosure Reports filed with the Secretary of State's Office, by 5:00 p.m. on the applicable deadline(s). May turn in to Circuit Clerk's Office for forwarding to Secretary of State.

# ***What am I getting myself into?***

## ***A Candidate's Guide to Mississippi's Ethics in Government Law***

### **STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTEREST DISCLOSURE**

- State law requires all candidates for elected office (with the exception of election commissions and levee boards) to file a Statement of Economic Interest with the Mississippi Ethics Commission within **15 days after the deadline for qualification** and every year thereafter.
- The form must be submitted **electronically** at the Ethics Commission's web site: [www.ethics.ms.gov](http://www.ethics.ms.gov).

### **GENERAL RESTRICTIONS**

The Ethics in Government Law will not stop anyone from running for public office. However, **if you are elected** to public office (municipal, county, or state office), the following restrictions will apply to you during your entire term of office and may also apply for one year after you leave office:

- You cannot be employed by the public body you represent. You, your employer and your business may not be able to contract, subcontract, sell or buy with/to/from the public body, directly or indirectly.
- Your wife or husband may not be able to work for the public body. If your spouse is already employed by the public body, he or she may have to quit his or her job.
- Your spouse's business or employer will probably be prohibited from doing business with the public body.
- You may face some legal restrictions if other relatives work for the public body or do business with the public body, including your parents, your children, your brothers and sisters and some of your in-laws.
- The Ethics Law is separate from the Nepotism Law and other state laws. Exceptions to other laws do not apply to the Ethics Law.



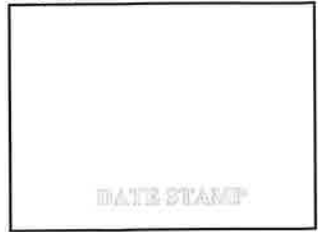

IMPORTANT

- (1) All candidates for office shall file periodic reports in the year in which they are to be elected.
- (2) Periodic Reports are mandatory, even if no expenditures were made during the period. In such case, the candidate shall submit a report indicating "0" (zero) for total amount of reported contributions and/or expenditures during this period. Pre-Election Reports are mandatory if the candidate is opposed.
- (3) Until a candidate files a Termination Report, annual reports must be filed in accordance with Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-807 (b) (ii) and (iii).
- (4) Beginning on Jan. 1, 2018, candidates and officeholders may not "personally use" campaign contributions. Section 23-15-821, Miss. Code Ann., sets forth those "personal use" expenditures which are specifically prohibited from campaign contributions and those disbursements which are not defined as "personal use" and therefore permissible from campaign contributions. Campaign contributions accepted and held prior to Jan. 1, 2018 ARE NOT subject to the "personal use" restrictions of Section 23-15-821, Miss. Code Ann. Beginning on Jan. 1, 2018, campaign contributions accepted and accumulated therefrom ARE subject to the "personal use"
